

	Community COVID-19 Hospital Admission Level	
Spiritual Care Element	Not High (Low/Medium )	HIGH
Pastoral Care Visits (Non- Trinity Health employed)	Follow normal ministry policies and procedures	Visits permitted to patients under investigation (PUI) and those in isolation for COVID-19. Visiting clergy are to follow infection prevention precautions including posted screening instructions at ministry entrance, source control and PPE as described in: ppe-guide-booklet.pdf (trinity-health.org)
Pastoral Care Visits (Trinity Health Colleagues)	No restrictions. Follow local ministry policies and procedures for visits to PUI or those under transmission-based isolation precautions	
Spiritual care volunteers	No restrictions. Follow local ministry policies and procedures for visits to PUI or those under transmission-based isolation precautions	
Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) interns & residents	No restrictions. Follow local ministry policies and procedures for visits to PUI or those under transmission-based isolation precautions	

Chapel Access & Use	No Restrictions	Precautions to consider:  Reduce no. of participants to 75% of normal capacity  Follow source control requirements that are in effect for the ministry  Provide hand sanitizer at chapel entrance
Holy Water in Fonts, Hymnal, Missalettes	No restrictions or limitations in use	

<sup>\*</sup>The term "Clergy" in this guidance means a person designated by a patient, resident or person authorized to make decisions on behalf of the patient or resident as having a leadership role within the patient 's or resident's faith community. Examples include but are not limited to persons serving as a priest, minister, elder, rabbi, pastor, imam, s haman, teacher bishop, deacon, bishopric, or elder quorum president. Managers of spiritual care or on call chaplains should be called as need to assist in assuring patient requests for spiritual care visits by community-based clergy are reviewed if there are any questions.
