Re: Shelter-in-place and state-of-emergency declarations guidance

Thank you for your commitment and everything you are doing to care for our patients, residents, communities and each other during this extraordinarily difficult time. Trinity Health has a critical role in our local and national COVID-19 pandemic response.

You may have read news about governmental authorities' guidance for health care workers when "shelter-in-place" and "state-of-emergency" declarations occur during this period. Today, we are sharing additional information. As the Nation comes together to slow the spread of COVID-19, on March 16, the President updated Coronavirus Guidance for America. This guidance states that:

"If you work in a critical infrastructure industry, as defined by the Department of Homeland Security, such as healthcare services and pharmaceutical and food supply, you have a special responsibility to maintain your normal work schedule."

As applied to health care workers, those working within a hospital and/or health care delivery system, or in support of the operation of a hospital or health care delivery system are deemed critical and essential and are categorically exempt from "shelter-in-place" and "state-of-emergency" declarations.

We must continue to perform these services to ensure safe patient and resident care and fulfill our Mission. As shared in recent communications, there are certain Trinity Health functions in which working from home is possible. Colleagues in those roles are working from home so that we can contribute to social distancing efforts in our communities to slow the spread of COVID-19. Colleagues who are currently working from home should continue working from home to contribute to social distancing efforts in our communities. This communication is intended for colleagues who are not and cannot work from home.

For purposes of a "shelter-in-place" declaration by a governmental authority, and consistent with the guidance provided by the Department of Homeland Security, those who work at Trinity Health and perform or provide the following services are deemed to be essential and have a special responsibility to be at work and maintain a normal work schedule in support of safe and uninterrupted patient care delivery. The following chart is not inclusive of all Trinity Health job titles, and Trinity Health may, under certain circumstances, deem services or roles to be essential/non-essential based on those circumstances. Under any and all circumstances, and no matter what your job title is, **direct, hands-on caregivers and those who support care delivery are essential colleagues and must report to work**.
